

Presence

I recently read a wonderful quote by author Richard Rohr that struck a deep chord within me. He wrote: "We cannot attain the presence of God. We're already totally in the presence of God. What's absent is awareness." I wonder how often I miss the presence of God in my life due to a lack of awareness?

I'm reminded of Mary in the resurrection story, who stands at the doorway of the empty tomb and doesn't realize that she's in the presence of the risen Lord. Because of her pain and grief, she doesn't recognize him. She thinks he's a simple gardener. But when he speaks her name, her eyes are opened, and she recognizes him. She becomes aware.

Or those disciples on the road to Emmaus... They spend hours walking and talking with Jesus, but don't recognize him for who he is, as they struggle with all of the circumstances they have been involved with in Jerusalem. But when he breaks the bread and pours the cup, their eyes are opened and they recognize him. They become aware.

It's easy to think that we need to somehow "seek God" or "find Jesus", when in reality He "never leaves us nor forsakes us". His presence is always with us. What is lacking is not God, but our awareness of God. We get so distracted by life, it's cares and its joys, that we lose sight of God right next to us, walking beside us, leading, supporting, providing.

As resurrected people, we are called to live in a spirit of awareness: Aware of the needs that surround us, so that we can respond with the light of Christ, but also, aware of God's constant presence in our lives.

May our prayer as Easter people be that our eyes and ears and hearts and minds and hands be aware...for God is with us.

May Mission of the Month Covenant World Missions

"I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send?' Then said I, 'Here am I, send me." Isaiah 6:8

All through the Bible, God sent people to participate in the mission of spreading God's love for the whole world... to reconcile people with God and with one another. Covenant World Mission (CWM) works to facilitate the establishment of culturally relevant communities of faith, worship, witness and ministries of compassion, mercy and justice around the world. Training and supporting over 130 missionaries in over 35 countries, developing indigenous leadership, establishing medical facilities, working to abolish sexual slave trade are just a few of the many services of this branch of the Covenant Church.

CWM also strives to be partners with those whom God has gifted and brought together in spreading the good news of God's love. This includes shared mission ventures with local church initiatives, para-church organizations, groups of key leaders and other specialized ministries. With the help of the Holy Spirit, CWM serves together with diverse communities - not defining, directing or controlling the process of change but rather through listening together for God's guidance. Projects range from providing clean water, sanitation and higher education in Ethiopia - to providing health screening exams to children in classes in Mexico - to building safe, sturdy, sanitary homes for those left homeless in Haiti - to assisting fish, pig and sheep farms in Thailand - to providing doctors in the Democratic Republic of Congo with vital medicines to treat victims of malaria, pneumonia and other diseases - to attending to refugees in Europe - to supporting a woman's shelter in Mongolia - to drug rehabilitation in South America - to pastoral training, leadership development and church planting in Asia, Latin America and Europe - and hundreds more projects.

CWM has partnered with World Vision to sponsor children in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Through these sponsorships, Covenant Kids Congo is helping to provide clean water, nutrition, education, health and micro-enterprise in the Equateur Province of Congo. Many people in our church have opened their hearts to sponsoring a child. This month we have an opportunity to support ALL the work of CWM. Please pray for this avenue of offering the love of God to all people everywhere.

Come enjoy our youth as they lead our service and then share the delicious food you and other bring. A real day of celebrating God's gift of family.


June 18: TIME CHANGE! 9:30 service
