Mission of the Month - December

The Mission of the Month for December is our Denomination - the Covenant Church. Founded in 1885 by Swedish immigrants who had very little, the Covenant Church was originally called Mission Friends. This name reflected their determination to make concern for people facing hardship the heart and hallmark of their church. Their struggles made them sensitive to the struggles of others. In their first year they managed to buy a house called the Home of Mercy where they cared for the sick, elderly and orphaned. In the past 130 years the Covenant Church has gone from its immigrant beginnings to a fast growing, multiethnic, multigenerational denomination of over 850 churches in the United States and Canada with ministry partnerships in 38 countries on 5 continents. In addition to hospitals, schools, retirement communities and camps, the denomination supports missions projects all over the world including medical missions, community development and disaster relief. They are involved in human trafficking awareness, racial reconciliation, homes for disabled adults, abuse victims advocacy, children's treatment facilities and much more including supporting new churches like ours over 35 years ago. We are privileged to support a denomination that has supported us and is so deeply rooted in the mission of mercy and justice and care for others especially those in need.


