"Follow Me"

There is in the Old City of Jerusalem, a section of ancient stone pavement known as the *Lithostrotos* (in Greek) or *Gabbatha* (in Aramaic). It is here, we are told in John 19:13, that the Roman governor, Pontius Pilate "brought Jesus forth, and sat down in the judgment seat". As Jesus stood on these very stones, with the crowds crying out for crucifixion, Pilate condemned Him to death.

Standing on these ancient stones is a powerful reminder of the cost associated with Jesus' call to "follow me." On these very stones Jesus carried his cross to Golgotha. As his disciples, Jesus calls us to follow him, not into some cloistered, protected, or sheltered hermit-like existence. He calls us to follow him out onto the pavement...out into the streets...out into the world. Christ's call to "Take up your cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24) is a call that leads us out, even as our faith grows within.

Author Mike Aquilina writes, "From its origin, then, Christianity was in the middle of the street, in the marketplace, in the amphitheaters, at the docks, on the ships, in the common areas of the villages and farmlands. Though monastic movements would later arise and draw individual believers into hermitages and enclosed communities, Christianity has always been, in the main, immersed in the world,

changing it from within – changing the hearts of people who walked the flagstones..."




BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENINGS


